AGWSR controls Royals, ends 11-9

t the risk of being repetitive, AGWSR Cougar head coach Mike Finger gave credit to his defense again Monday night. Rightly so, as his squad held the visiting Colo-NESCO Royals (6-16) to just five second-half points in Ackley on their way to a 48-14 win. It ended his first regular season at the helm with an 11-9 mark.

While this may have been the most consistent four quarters of the season as AGWSR's gears up for its regional home opener Thursday against Fort Dodge St. Edmond, Finger said it was more of the same, at least defensively. AGWSR forced 20 turnovers and held the Royals to just 10-percent shooting from the floor.

"I might sound like a broken record, but we had another really good defensive effort tonight," Finger said. "Thankfully, our girls recognize that that's our bread and butter - that if we play really good defense it gives us a chance to win. Our goal all season long is to take better care of the basketball and execute on offense. We did that Friday night and again tonight. It was a little bit rough in the first half, but in the second half, we were doing a much better job."

The Royals never got out of the starting gate as AGWSR raced out to a 9-1 first-quarter lead. The half as the hosts limited
