Kala is a physical therapist, Alyssa is an attorney, Tessa is a loan officer at a bank, and Tarin is a veterinarian.

Alyssa graduated from COU in 2006 and was involved in everything: volleyball, basketball, softball, track, choir, band, speech, student council, and she even video taped football games for the team. She was also involved in 4-H as well as our Catholic youth organization.

"At Charter Oak-Ute, we were team players to keep our programs thriving,"Alyssa said.

Alyssa went to Iowa State University and majored in political science (graduated in 2009). She attended law school at the University of South Dakota and graduated in 2013.

She practices law in Cherokee and Mapleton and lives on a farm in Pierson.

"Everything I learned from time management, prevailing in the face of adversity, to goal setting and local support at Charter Oak-Ute has been of use to me as an attorney," Alyssa said. 
