Many companies have opted into remote working instead of traditional office space, leaving many people without a designated place to work and collaborate. Kweken Co. will be the solution to this problem. REGION — One year ago, a group of motivated Christian leaders formulated a plan to empower and encourage the next generation of Christian men. One of them was Don DeKok, former pastor of Maurice Reformed Church. "We would see all these events for women, bringing women together for spiritual retreats and events, and we thought we should start something positive for guys," he said.

"We started with the idea that as men, we need to mend our own lives so we can mend the world," he said, adding, "Jesus men stand out."

The concept they are working with is to provide opportunities for men to speak into each other's lives through the teachings of Jesus. Through this, let it translate into how they relate with their spouses, kids, work relationships, and everything they encounter.

Noll fills a vacancy created by the addition of four new district associate judge positions authorized by the legislature in this year's session. Judicial Election District 3B includes Crawford, Ida, Monona, Plymouth, Sioux, and Woodbury counties.
