Manchester trooper receives valor award

Iowa State Trooper and Manchester resident Devin Brooks was one of two Iowa State Patrol Troopers to receive the Sullivan Brothers Award for Valor for lifesaving efforts performed during a car accident in Blackhawk County on July 1, 2022.

According to the Iowa Department of Public Safety (IDPS) website, the award is named in memory of George, Frank, Joe, Matt and Albert Sullivan, who served together on the USS Juneau during the Guadalcanal naval battle in the fall of 1942. All five brothers died together when Japanese torpedoes struck their ship.

According to the IDPS website, the award is given to peace officers, firefighters or any first responders who, while serving in an official capacity, distinguished themselves by the performance of a heroic act in excess of normal demands where the person was fully aware of the threat to his/her public safety.

Brooks, along with Trooper Boyd Eser, were returning to Post 10 in Oelwein after conducting an interview in Cedar

"We were deciding which way to take back to the office and had decided on one specific route," Brooks explained. "Once we left, on the spur of the moment, I decided to take a different route — we came across a bunch of cars at an intersection and a bunch of smoke."

Brooks said he couldn't see the cars in the ditch and initially thought they were approaching a grass fire. Drivers already on the scene told the troopers two people in one of the cars were trapped.

With the engine compartment of the car on fire, Brooks entered the car through the back door.

"I couldn't see in there, but worked my way to the front seat and grabbed ahold of the driver and pulled her into the back seat - with the help of others, we got her out of the
