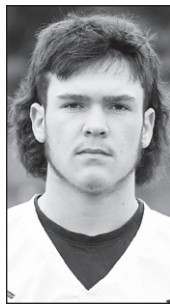

## Turnovers plague C-M football in home loss to Madrid

COLFAX — Madrid's defense registered two sacks, three interceptions and eight tackles for loss and the Tigers also recovered two fumbles during a 67-6

road win over Colfax-Mingo's football team on Oct. 7.

The Tigerhawks were limited to less than 150 total yards and surrendered 329 rushing yards in the Class A District 6 matchup.

The Tigers clinched the No. 2 seed from the district for the playoffs after the win.

Shane Hostetter finished 3-of-8 through the air for 70 yards, but he also threw a pick. He rushed for a touchdown and hauled in five Cael Bracewell passes for 22 yards.

Bracewell was 10-of-17 through the air for 45 yards and two picks.

Curtis Horras caught four passes for 67 yards and Xavier Woods had two catches for 14 yards.

Brock Nichol led Colfax-Mingo (0-7 overall, 0-5 in the district) in rushing with 40 yards on seven carries.

Nichol also led the defense with seven tackles, Hostetter registered four tackles and Horras snagged an interception.

Preston Wicker led Madrid (5-2, 4-1) with 141 passing yards, 102 rushing yards and five total touchdowns. The Tigers averaged 11 yards per carry.

## C-M XC finishes third, fourth at Montezuma

MONTEZUMA — Highlighted by a top-five finish from Shae Wilkins, Colfax-Mingo's cross country teams competed at the Montezuma Cross Country Invitational on Oct. 6.

Colfax-Mingo ran a 5K around Big Springs Shooting Complex, and six Tigerhawks secured top-20 finishes.

The C-M girls were third in the four-team standings and the boys placed fourth in a five-team field.

Wilkins led the Tigerhawks with a fourth-place finish in the girls' race. She was clocked in 22 minutes, 48 seconds.

Harrison Rhone was the top Tigerhawk male in eighth. He finished in 19:03. The top 20 finishers in each varsity race earned medals.

Collins-Maxwell won the girls' meet title with 28 points, while Montezuma was second with 45. Colfax-Mingo scored 67 points in third and South Tama County was fourth with 80. The incomplete teams were BGM, English Valleys, GMG and Moravia.

Collins-Maxwell's Cypress Erickson won the girls' 5K race in 22:20 and Montezuma's Claire Esselius was the runner-up in 22:35.

Finishing behind Wilkins for the Tigerhawks were McKenna Pleima (25:29) in 13th, Devan Chadwick (26:17) in 16th and Bianca Lane (26:33) in 19th. The final scoring runner was Lilyan Hadsall (29:02) in 30th and Mallory Sipma (31:41) was a non-scoring runner in 33rd.

Class 3A No. 17 South Tama won the boys' meet title with 22 points. Collins-Maxwell (68), Montezuma (72), Colfax-Mingo (82) and GMG (121) completed the five-team field.

The incomplete squads included Belle Plaine, BGM, English Valleys, HLV, Moravia and Tri-County.

Class 3A No. 6 Tommy Tynismaa of South Tama won the boys' race in 17:02. English Valley's Gage Heyne was the

runner-up in 17:25 and state-ranked Ethan Haus of Collins-Maxwell was third.

After Rhone for C-M was Josue Rodriguez in 12th with a time of 19:44.

The other scoring runners for the Tigerhawks included Tony Buenrostro (21:16) in 26th, Xavier Woods (21:28) in 27th and Carter Gibson (21:40) in 30th.

The non-scoring Tigerhawks were John McGill (21:42) in 31st, Owen Ament (22:00) in 34th, Gage Byal (22:01) in 35th, Austin Lane (22:25) in 40th and Seth Brant (24:52) in 50th.

## Tigerhawks compete at North Polk Invitational

ALLEMAN — Greenlee Smock used a late kick to claim another victory, Olivia Norrish raced to her best time ever and three Lynnville-Sully boys finished in the top 20 at the North Polk Invitational on Oct. 3.

Smock won the girls' 5K race and Norrish was 10th to lead the L-S girls to fourth place and the Hawks boys were fifth.

Colfax-Mingo also competed and the girls were sixth

in the eight-team field, while the boys finished ninth in the nine-team field.

Smock, who is ranked 19th in Class 1A and was voted Homecoming Queen a few days prior, used a kick with about 1,000 meters to go to pass 3A No. 27 Liza Schaffer of North Polk and finished with a personal-best time of 19 minutes, 21 seconds to win the girls' race.

Wilkins highlighted Colfax-Mingo in 21st. She finished in 22:59.

Pleima (25:02) was 40th, Hadsall (26:18) placed 56th, Lane (26:22) took 58th and Chadwick (26:38) finished 61st as the other scoring runners.

Sipma (31:45) was 81st as the lone non-scoring runner for the Tigerhawks.

Schaffer was the runner-up in the girls' race with a time of 19:50. That led 3A No. 9 North Polk to the meet championship. The Comets were 2-3-4-7 and finished with 28 points.

Nevada (69), Bondurant-Farrar (73), Lynnville-Sully (110) and Des Moines Lincoln (130) capped the top five and the rest of the field included Colfax-Mingo

(168), Des Moines Christian (182) and Ankeny Christian Academy (191).

In the boys' race, 3A No. 2 North Polk finished with a perfect score after all five scoring runners went 1-2-3-4-5.

Class 3A No. 3 Zach Spora won the race in 15:36, while 3A No. 13 Max Spora was the runner-up in 16:38.

Nevada (74), Bondurant-Farrar (106), Des Moines Lincoln (110) and Lynnville-Sully (158) completed the top five and Boone (183), Des Moines Christian (190), Ankeny Christian Academy (191) and Colfax-Mingo (225) rounded out the nine-team field.

Colfax-Mingo was led by Rhone, who finished 28th in 18:39. Rodriguez (20:12) was 59th, Woods (20:40) placed 69th and Buenrostro (21:10) came across the finish line in 76th.

Byal (21:32) was the final scoring runner for C-M in 83rd and Ament (21:34), McGill (21:46), Gibson (21:47), Lane (22:22) and Brant (23:46) all were non-scoring runners in 84th, 89th, 90th, 99th and 114th, respectively.

C-M's biggest lead of the set came when Rawlins ended the frame with back-to-back aces.

The Tigerhawks (10-13 overall, 3-5 in the SICL) fell behind 6-1 in the second set, but kills by Charlotte Donahue and Smith and an ace by Cunningham trimmed the deficit to 7-6 and the home team eventually went in front 8-7.

There were ties at 8-, 9- and 10-all before Colfax-Mingo scored seven straight to gain control of the set. The run included back-to-back kills by Cunningham, two aces by Smith and a Rawlins push from the back row.

English Valleys (9-14, 2-6) rallied to tie the set at 23-, 24- and 25-all before back-to-back points by the Tigerhawks ended the game.

The Bears scored the first three points of the third set, but C-M rallied. Woods and Smith put down consecutive kills to help the Tigerhawks go in front 10-5 and then aces from Rawlins and Smith and a kill from Cunningham helped the Tigerhawks move ahead 14-8.

English Valleys got as close as 14-11 before a 6-0 run by C-M put the home team in front for good.

Cunningham's kill and ace on back-to-back points pushed the lead to 22-12 and two points from Smith down the stretch closed out the three-set win.

"We tend to play really well here and like crap on the road," C-M head volleyball coach Michelle Grant said.

"We look like completely different teams home and away. I begged them in the

locker room to please bring that team on the road. Because the team we put out there tonight doesn't lose."

Cunningham and Smith led the Tigerhawks with 12 and 10 kills, respectively.

They lead C-M in kills for the season with 188 and 155 but the next closest hitter has 29.

"We don't have as many veteran attackers as we had last year, but it's more about our passing," Grant said.

"We can't set those other attackers if we don't have a decent pass."

Cunningham's double-double included 12 kills and 23

digs and she also had five aces. She leads the team with 211 digs and 41 aces this fall.

Smith's double-double featured 10 kills and 10 digs and she chipped in two aces. She has 155 kills, 160 digs and 41 aces this season.

Stackhouse registered 24 assists, six digs and two aces, Chadwick finished with 15 digs and two aces and Rawlins added nine digs and three aces.

Donahue put down three kills and had three digs and Woods collected two kills and three aces.

The Tigerhawks missed 12 serves (64-of-76), but Chadwick finished 12-of-12. Smith

and Rawlins both served 10-of-11.

Chadwick leads the Tigerhawks with a 96.3 serving percentage and she has totaled 184 digs.

"The serve is what gets us sometimes, and I figure having a few consistent servers can help our team," Chadwick said about her approach to serving. "We have others who can go for the ace all the time."

Grant wants the serve to improve. The players need to have more confidence in it, too, but it did factor into the win.

"We asked the girls what they were thinking when they serve one day at practice," Grant said. "Four of them said they weren't trying to get an ace all the time. And four of them said they are thinking about not missing. We can't think about not missing."

"They were out of system a lot on our serves though. It was effective tonight."

**Sigourney 3, Colfax-Mingo 0**  
SIGOURNEY — Stackhouse had a double-double, but Colfax-Mingo lost to Sigourney on Oct. 4.

The Savages swept the Tigerhawks 25-13, 25-15, 25-6 during an SICL cross-division matchup.

Stackhouse finished with 11 assists and 10 digs, Smith added five kills, five digs and two aces and Cunningham chipped in four kills and five digs.

Chadwick collected 12 digs, Rawlins had six digs and Donahue and Woods each registered two blocks.

The Tigerhawks were 28-of-35 in serves with three aces.

Sigourney (19-6, 7-1) was led by Josephine Moore's seven kills and 17 digs. Macy Fisch chipped in 10 kills.
