C-M's Underwood enjoys Drake experience

DES MOINES - Colfax-Mingo's Carley Underwood didn't have qualifying for the Drake Relays as one of her goals coming into her senior season.

That's why being able to compete in the annual event on the blue oval was even more special.

"Qualifying for this wasn't even part of my goals so just to make it here is amazing," Underwood said. "It was an amazing experience. It wasn't my best race. A few of the first hurdles were sloppy."

Underwood came into the 100-meter hurdles event as the 27th seed in the 32-person field. Her qualifying time was a career-best 15.71 seconds.

She got off to a fast start in the preliminary race, but adrenaline got the best of her. She wound up finishing 30th with a time of 16.53.

"I floated over too many hurdles," Underwood said. "I could have stayed a little lower. I hoped the adrenaline and the nervous energy would help me, but it was just a little sloppy."

Ali Frandsen of Ames ran the fastest preliminary time and then claimed the Drake Relays championship later in the day with a time of 14.33 seconds.

Colfax-Mingo will compete in a Class 2A state qualifier at

Van Meter later this month. Ogden's Taydem Graden and Treynor's Clara Teigland also will be at that site.

Teigland made the Drake Relays final in the 100 hurdles but was disqualified after a false start. Graden placed

28th with a time of 16.12 seconds.

"I'm trying to work my way back from a groin injury," Underwood said. "I need to be more consistent with my form and keeping my trail leg up."

Colfax-Mingo head girls

track and field coach Zach Tomas thinks Underwood will be motivated to finish her senior season strong.

"It certainly wasn't the race she wanted to have, but it doesn't take away from all the work she put in to make it there," Tomas said. "She was a little banged up coming in and hit the first few hurdles in the race."

Rainsbarger's winning time in the 110 high hurdles was clocked in 16.09 seconds. He also finished third in the long jump with a leap of 17 feet, 8 1/2 inches.

Treyton Travis finished third in the high jump with a mark of 5-8. He also placed sixth in the 100 (12.59).

The Bolts scored double points in the 200 and 400. Cade Robinson (24.91) was fourth in the 200 and James Esqueda (25.91) finished sixth. In the 400, Logan Jones (56.05) took third and Esqueda (56.76) was fifth.

Perrin Sulzle also grabbed a sixth-place finish in the 400 hurdles with a time of 1:04.62.
