The match was tied at 1-all at halftime but a 2-1 advantage in the second half pushed the visitors to the victory.

Aiden Downs added an assist and Lucas Barnes registered 11 saves for CIU, which had nine shots in the win.

Richardson now has a team-best 11 goals and 24 points this spring.

It was the second straight loss for Van Meter, which fell to 3-6. The victory snapped a two-game skid by Central Iowa United (4-7).

# Tigerhawk girls edge Bolts at West Marshall

STATE CENTER — The Lynnville-Sully girls' track and field team had the lone wins from the area during the West Marshall High School Coed Invitational on April 27.

The Hawks claimed three victories and six runner-up finishes and that production helped L-S finish second in the girls' team standings. The Hawks scored 129 points, trailing host and meet champion West Marshall (140) by 11 points.

Colfax-Mingo registered five third-place finishes and edged Baxter by .5 points. The Bolts had nine top-three finishes and their 92 points put them in fifth.

Colfax-Mingo scored 92.5 points in fourth and South Hamilton (127) was edged out by L-S in third. The rest of the eight-team field included

South Tama County (61), Colo-NESCO (40.5) and Meskwaki Settlement School (15).

Pleima grabbed the Tigerhawks' two second-place finishes. She was the runner-up in the 100 hurdles (17.44) and 400 hurdles (1:12.58).

The five third-place finishes included the shuttle hurdle relay. The team of Caylee Cunningham, Trinity Smith, Cadence Linn and Pleima completed the race in 1:15.67. The 4x100 relay team of Olivia Rausch, Karmylia Snyder, Jenah Jones and Emmalyn Buchman also took third in 55.9 seconds.

Rausch (14.0) was third in the 100, Shae Wilkins (13:31.24) finished third in the 3,000 and Holland Robinette (30-0) ended up third in the shot put.
