C-M girls finish third, Baxter fourth at DMC Invitational

URBANDALE — A trio of seniors headlined the Colfax-Mingo girls' track and field team's day at the Des Moines Christian High School Coed Invitational on April 24.

Carley Underwood won the 100-meter hurdles, McKenna Pleima ran to a win in the 400 hurdles and Holland Robinette grabbed a pair of top-two finishes in the throwing events as the Tigerhawks scored 132 points in third place.

Baxter was held out of the win column but a plethora of third-place performances helped the Bolts take fourth with 109 points.

Host Des Moines Christian and West Central Valley both scored 170 points at the top of the standings. Ti-County (45) and Ankeny Christian (44) completed the six-team field.

Underwood and Pleima were 1-2 in the 100 hurdles and Pleima anchored the Tigerhawks to a win the shuttle hurdle relay.

Underwood, a Drake Relays qualifier in the event, won the 100 hurdles in 16.78 seconds and Pleima was second in 17.48.

Pleima's winning time in the 400 hurdles was clocked in 1 minute, 13.13 seconds.

The shuttle hurdle relay team of Caylee Cunningham, Trinity Smith, Evalyn Anderson and Pleima recorded a winning time of 1:15.82.

Robinette grabbed the fourth win in the shot put. Her best throw covered 29 feet, 5 1/2 inches and she also was second in the discus with a toss of 81-7. Keira Kono placed fifth in both events with

throws of 24-4 1/2 and 70-3, respectively.

The individual third-place finish was collected by Shae Wilkins (13:22.71) in the 3,000. Olivia Rausch finished fourth in the 100 (14.15) and fifth in the 200 (30.41) and Smith took fifth in the long jump with a leap of 14-7 1/4.

The Tigerhawks grabbed bronze medals in the 4x100, 4x200 and distance medley relays.

The 4x100 team included Rausch, Jenah Jones, Cunningham and Pleima and they finished in 55.72 seconds.

Jones, Smith, Cunningham and Rausch completed the 4x200 in 2:01.76 and the distance medley relay team of Karmylia Snyder, Rachael Uecker, Felicity Woods and Addie Schroeder scored a time of 5:04.12.

The Bolts' lone second-place finish came from Mandee Selover. She was the runner-up in the 400 in a time of 1:04.8. She also placed third in the 100 in 13.87 and third in the long

jump with a leap of 15-4.

Adison Bonney took third in both the shot put and discus with throws of 25-6 and 80-3, respectively. Callie Cross finished fourth in the shot put with a heave of 24-9.

Bree Buswell (17.53) and Camryn Russell (18.28) were third and fifth, respectively, in the 100 hurdles and Buswell placed fourth in the 200 in 29.96. Russell took fourth in the long jump with a mark of 14-11.

Abby McReynolds had a jump of 4-6 to place fifth in the high jump and Zoey Gliem was fifth in the 800 with a time of 2:43.32.

In the shuttle hurdle, the team of Grace Anderegg, Lilyan Headlee, Russell and Buswell finished third in 1:16.46.

Buswell, Russell, Selover and Morgan Ratliff finished third in the 4x400 in 4:38.09 and third in the 4x800 and the team of Ratliff, Regan Russell, Caydence Sulzle and Gliem finished in 11:24.94.

Smith (14-8 1/2) and Rausch (13-10) were 4-6 in the long jump, Smith (2:51.7) also placed fifth in the 800 and Addie Schroeder (5:59.39) took fourth in the 1,500.

Cunningham (18.56) gave the Tigerhawks double points in the 100 hurdles following a

fifth-place finish.

The Bolts registered six second-place finishes and three third-place tallies.

Mandee Selover led the Bolts with three top-three finishes. She was second in the 400 (1:04.18), third in the 200 (29.04) and second in the long jump (15-4 1/2).

Camryn Russell finished third in the 100 hurdles (18.01) and third in the long jump (14-

10 1/2), Bree Buswell ended up fifth in both the 100 (14.14) and 200 (29.57) and Regan Russell placed second in the 800 (2:44.61) and fifth in the 1,500 (6:04.01).

Lilyan Headlee grabbed a sixth-place finish in the 400 hurdles. Her time was clocked in 1:33.35.

Baxter was second in the 4x400, 4x800 and shuttle hurdle relays.

In the 4x400 relay, the team of Buswell, Morgan Ratliff, Camryn Russell and Selover finished in 4:40.38.

Regan Russell, Zoey Gliem, Caydence Sulzle and Ratliff completed the 4x800 in 10:51.09.

The shuttle hurdle relay team included Grace Anderegg, Headlee, Buswell and Camryn Russell and they finished the race in 1:15.6.
