Tigerhawks down Baxter in county battle

BAXTER — Nine hits, nine walks, six hit by pitches and 10 steals powered the Colfax-Mingo softball team to a five-inning win over Baxter on May 25.

The Tigerhawks jumped out in front with a five-run second inning and then added a pair of runs in the third, seven in the fourth and three in the fifth during a 17-3 non-conference road victory.

The Bolts avoided the 12-run mercy rule after four innings following a run in the fourth, but C-M put the game away in the fifth.

Charlotte Donahue started the five-run second frame with a single and then she stole second and third base. Caylee Cunningham, Madison Stackhouse and Trinity Smith all walked.

Donahue eventually scored on a wild pitch and Carley Underwood registered a two-run triple before scoring on a passed ball.

In the third, Cunningham laced an RBI double and then scored on a wild pitch to make it 7-0.

Cunningham doubled and tripled and finished with four runs, one RBI, one walk and one steal and she was hit by a pitch.

Baxter got on the board in the third. Holly Zahurones' RBI groundout made it 7-1 and then Morgan Hansen and Mandee Selover both reached on bunt singles. Selover eventually scored to make it 7-2.

Selover added an RBI sin-

gle in the fourth to extend the game to another inning. She finished with two hits, one run, one RBI and one steal to lead the Bolts (0-4).

Underwood and Donahue both had two hits for the Tigerhawks. Underwood tripled, scored two runs, had four RBIs and was hit by a pitch and Donahue added three runs, three steals and one RBI.

Holland Robinette, Stackhouse and Dakota Allen registered the other Tigerhawk

hits. Robinette doubled and contributed one RBI and two walks and Stackhouse scored two runs, walked once, stole two bases, was hit by a pitch and contributed an RBI.

Allen added one run, one RBI and one steal and she was hit by two pitches. Abi Rawlins walked twice, scored one run and stole one base, Macie Porter walked once, scored one run and stole two bases and Smith walked twice, scored one run and was hit by a pitch. Brooklyn Yanske

scored one run.

The Tigerhawks out-hit the Bolts 9-2 and Baxter committed four errors.

Rawlins (3-2) earned the pitching win as she surrendered no earned runs on one hit and she struck out two, walked one and hit one batter in three innings.

Allen tossed the final two frames and allowed one earned run on two hits and struck out two, walked one and hit one batter.

Baxter's Karlee Koehler was hit by two pitches, Caydence Sulzle and Zahurones both walked once, Kendall Brummel tallied one hit and Camden Moffit scored one run. Zahurones took the pitching loss.

Colfax-Mingo 6, BGM 3

COLFAX — A five-run fifth inning pulled the Tigerhawks away from BGM for good and Colfax-Mingo ended its first week of the season with a 6-3 home victory on May 26.

Both teams scored one run in the first and the Bears added single runs in the fifth and seventh frames.

Each team committed two errors and the Tigerhawks (3-2 overall, 2-1 in the conference) out-hit the Bears 7-3 during the South Iowa Cedar League contest.

Cunningham led the Tigerhawk offense with two hits and one steal. Underwood, Rawlins, Robinette, Donahue and Olivia Rausch all finished with one hit.

Underwood scored one run, totaled one RBI and stole

one base, Rawlins doubled, walked once, had one RBI and stole one base and Robinette doubled, drove in two runs and scored one.

Donahue registered an RBI and stole a base, Rausch tripled and scored one run, Stackhouse walked once, Allen scored one run and Kaylee Collins swiped one base.

Rawlins earned the pitching win after allowing two earned runs on two hits with one strikeout, four walks and two hit batters in seven innings.

Ryanne Van Dee led BGM (2-2, 1-2) with one hit, two runs, one walk, one hit by a pitch and two steals.

MONTEZUMA — The Tigerhawks had just one hit against Montezuma but still found a way to down the Braves in extra innings during SICL play on May 24.

Colfax-Mingo trailed 1-0 through five innings, tied the game in the sixth and then won 2-1 following a run in the top of the eighth.

Bracewell tossed the final two innings, stayed at 25 pitches and struck out five of the six batters he faced for the win. He allowed no hits and no runs and walked none.

Montezuma (1-1, 1-1) out-hit Colfax-Mingo 4-1, but the Braves committed two errors.

The Tigerhawks' lone hit

was a double by Dalton. Nathan Sloan, Bracewell and Hunter all walked once, Nathan Sloan scored both runs and stole one base and Bracewell was hit by a pitch and stole one base.

Edwards pitched the first six innings and surrendered one earned run on four hits and struck out nine, walked three and hit one batter on 110 pitches.

Owen Cook threw 112 pitches and took the loss for Montezuma despite allowing no earned runs and striking out 17.

Lynnville-Sully 17, Colfax-Mingo 2

COLFAX — A slow start doomed the Tigerhawks against Class 1A No. 6 Lynnville-Sully on May 22.

The Hawks scored 10 runs in the first inning and Col-

fax-Mingo committed seven errors in the SICL loss.

Colfax-Mingo was led by Dalton, who finished with one hit, one run and one walk.

Edwards had one hit and scored one run, Ayden Sloan walked once and was hit by a pitch and Hunter walked once. Bracewell's hit was a double.
