Rushing attack, special teams lead Mustangs past Chariton

MONROE — A fast start propelled PCM's football team to an easy win over Chariton on Oct. 7 during 2A District 7 action.

August Stock scored three first-half rushing touchdowns to help the Mustangs lead 35-0 at halftime and PCM went on to win 42-7.

Gavin Van Gorp hooked up with Gavin Fenton on 16-yard pass play for the Mustangs' only second-half touchdown.

The win locks up a top-

three finish in the district for the Mustangs. They play Roland-Story for the No. 2 seed this week.

The Mustangs (4-3 overall, 3-1 in the district) scored on

their opening drive after Van Gorp found Gabe Hobbs for a 20-yard touchdown.

PCM's special teams blocked Chariton's first three punts of the game and the Mustangs took advantage of the short fields each time.

All three scoring drives covered less than 15 yards.

Stock scored all three touchdowns on the ground, reaching paydirt on runs of 2, 10 and 13 yards. Adrien Robbins also scored on a 5-yard TD run in

the second.

Robbins led the offense with 86 rushing yards and the one TD on 14 carries. Stock added 60 yards and three TDs on seven carries and Kaleb DeVries rushed for 37 yards on five carries.

Van Gorp was 5-of-12 through the air for 74 yards, two touchdowns and two picks. His five completions went to five different receivers.

Hobbs caught a 20-yard TD pass, Fenton hauled in a 16-yard TD pass, Stock had one

Teeter, True lead PCM at HOIC meet

STATE CENTER — Four Mustangs finished in the top 15 and PCM's girls' cross country team placed in the upper half of the Heart of Iowa Conference meet on Oct. 10.

Abi Teeter, Makayla True and Reagan Vannoy led the Mustang girls to third in the eight-team field.

Coby DeRaad also was in the top 15 to lead the PCM boys to eighth place at Lincoln Valley Golf Course.

Nevada won the girls' team title with 26 points. The Cubs put all five scoring runners in the top 15, finishing in 3-5-10-11-15.

Roland-Story finished in the first two positions but settled for second with 59 points.

PCM (88), West Marshall (92), Perry (144), Saydel (146), South Hamilton (152) and Greene County (162) completed the eight-team field.

Roland-Story's Claire Truesdell won the girls' 5K race in 21 minutes, 13.46 seconds. Lauren Kilstofte of Roland-Story was the runner-up in 21:41.8.

Teeter and True came across the finish line at the same time with Teeter (22:04.22) finishing sixth and True (22:04.8) coming in seventh.

Vannoy placed 14th in 23:30.81 and the other two scoring runners were Riley DeVore (26:01.94) in 29th and Alyce Engle (26:31.33) in 34th.

The two non-scoring runners were Alexis Fagg (26:51.99) in 36th and Jillian Fairbanks (28:30.63) in 55th.

Nevada dominated the boys' team race to complete the conference sweep. The Cubs put their top five runners in the first 11 positions and scored 26 points. Carter Holland won the race in 18:02.84.

Greene County (69), South Hamilton (94), West Marshall (103), Perry (123), Roland-Story (155), Saydel (171) and PCM (181) completed the eight-team field.

Landon Grove of South Hamilton was the 5K runner-up in 18:14.33.

DeRaad led the Mustangs in 12th with a time of 19:44.55. Carson Taylor (21:41.33) was 43rd, Leighton McClure (21:44.65) finished 44th, Charlie Ford (22:06.2) took 49th and Wyatt Vannoy (23:17.42) placed 64th as the final scoring runners.

The two non-scoring runners for PCM were Carter Dudley (24:42.33) in 77th and Jacob Buys (27:08.08) in 90th.

Mustang girls finish seventh, boys 14th at Chariton Invitational

MORAVIA — Three PCM girls finished in the top 30, DeRaad once again led the Mustang boys and PCM's cross country teams faced large fields at the Chariton Cross Country Invitational on Oct. 4.

The Mustangs girls were seventh out of 16 teams at The Preserve Golf Course and PCM's boys were 14th in the 15-team field.

Teeter led the PCM girls in 12th with a time of 21:16.

Reagan Vannoy (22:05) and True (22:12) both finished in the top 30, placing 27th and 30th, respectively.

DeVore (25:06) and Engle (26:07) were the final scoring runners in 91st and 108th, respectively.

Fagg (26:39), Fairbanks (26:53) and Emma Heibert (29:09) were non-scoring runners in 114th, 116th and 132nd,

Dudley (23:43) and Buys (25:04) were non-scoring runners in 169th and 187th, respectively.

Class 2A No. 14 Kaden Van Wynn-garden of Pella Christian won the boys' race in 16:10. Isaac Rankin of Knoxville was the runner-up in 16:51.

Class 2A No. 10 Pella Christian won the boys' meet title with 47 points.

Oskaloosa (74), Fort Madison (87), Chariton (93) and Albia (179) completed the top five. PCM scored 361 points in 14th.
