Roland-Story, West Marshall too much for Mustangs

STORY CITY — PCM's volleyball team faced Roland-Story for a third time this season on Oct. 6. This time, the meeting was a Heart of Iowa Conference matchup.

Like the other two, the Lady Norse got the better of the Mustangs and claimed a 25-13, 25-19, 25-22 victory at home.

Roland-Story improved to 3-0 against PCM this fall.

"This is the third time we've matched up against R-S and each time we've improved our play," PCM head volleyball coach Sarah De Vries said. "We will always meet teams that are bigger and stronger than we are, but my goal for our girls is to always push themselves to play better and we did that."

Addison Steenhoek highlighted the Mustangs' night with four kills and nine digs.

Reese Palm put down five kills, Elle Davis had four kills and Riley Johannes chipped in three kills and two digs.

Eliana Buswell dished out seven assists, Sidney Shaver delivered six assists and Skylar Burns and Ella Schendel each tallied five digs.

The Mustangs (10-20 overall, 1-4 in the HOIC) were 47-of-55 in serves with seven aces. Joslin Briles served up two aces and was 10-of-11 in serves. Palm served 9-of-10 and Burns was 7-of-8.

"Each set, we were able to score more points with aggressive serving and adjusting our defense against their hitters," De Vries said.

Roland-Story (16-11, 3-2) was led by Ali Charlson's 24 assists, 11 digs and five aces.

Reagan Faber had 10 kills and seven digs and Madelyn Risdal put down 12 kills. The Lady Norse were 64-of-73 in serves with seven
