Mustangs finish fifth in large field at The Preserve

MORAVIA — PCM head boys golf coach Collin Harrison left his top three golfers at home for the Mustangs' tournament at The Preserve on Thursday.

Harrison wanted to get a better feel for the bottom part of his lineup.

Despite not having Grant Van Veen, Jeffrey McDanel or Easton Van Veen, the Mustangs still placed fifth in the 18-team field at the Moravia Invitational.

Four golfers fired career-best rounds, a pair of Mustangs made their season

debut at the varsity level and PCM shot 323 in fifth.

Tate Tangeman led the Mustangs for the first time this season. He carded a career-best 78 with nine-hole splits of 36-42.

Pete Kiernan, a varsity player last year, made his debut this season and carded a career-best 79. His splits were 40-39.

Charlie Ford also had a career-best 82 and Nick Farver's 84 completed the counting scorers. Gavin Steenhoek made his varsity debut and turned in an 88.

Knoxville's Evan Smith won medalist honors with a 67. Oskaloosa's Jonathan Terpstra was the runner-up medalist with a 71.

The Panthers won the meet championship with a 307. Oskaloosa and Albia both shot 317 and Pella's 322 completed the top five.

Ayla Barrett and Karr gave the Mustangs a 1-2 finish in the high jump and Rylee Gallaher and Chloe Greiner were 1-2 in the shot put.

Barrett won the high jump with a career-best leap of 5 feet, 0 inches and Karr was second with a jump of 4-10.

Gallaher's first-place throw in the shot put covered 36-3 and Greiner was second with a career-best toss of 31-11. Rylie Muck placed fifth with a 29-4.

Karr (16.44) and Lindsay (17.88) were 1-3 in 100 hurdles and Abi Teeter (11:58.88) and Makayla True (season-best 12:53.44) finished 1-3 in the 3,000.

Jorja Teeter (ca-

reer-best 27.95) and Karr (career-best 27.96) ended up 2-3 in the 200 and Koonce (1:07.24) and Sophia Steenhoek (1:09.33) were 2-3 in the 400.

The 2-4 finishes came from Lindsay (1:13.75) and Addison Steenhoek (1:20.09) in the 400 hur-

dles, Abi Teeter (2:45.25) and Raegan Vanoy (3:00.53) in the 800 and Jorja Teeter (career-best 14-3 1/2) and Lexi Fagg (career-best 13-9) in the long jump.

Gallaher added a second-place finish in the discus to her day. She grabbed the silver medal with a toss of 85-3.

Paige Steenhoek

placed second in the 1,500 with a season-best 5:38.9. Lindsay (14.46) and Bennett (14.69) were 3-4 in the 100 and Shannon had a career-best leap of 13-7 to place fifth in the long jump.

Mustangs finish 10th at Carlisle

CARLISLE — The 13-team field at the Carlisle High School Girls Wildcat Relays on April 27 featured mostly programs in 3A or 4A.

PCM was one of the

few smaller schools in attendance and the Mustangs did not use several athletes either.

A runner-up finish in the high jump by Ayla Barrett led the way as the Mustangs (24) were 10th.

Barrett's best mark in the high jump was 4-10. Koonce also placed fifth in the 400 dash with a time of 1:04.5 and Abi Teeter finished fifth in the 1,500 with a time of 5:26.89.

Chloe Greiner registered a sixth-place finish

in the shot put with a toss of 32-5 3/4.

PCM did not have its seniors as they got back from a Senior Trip earlier in the day.

Urbandale (139) won the meet, while host Carlisle (105.5), North Polk (93.5), ADM (89) and Norwalk (72) completed the top five. Bondurant-Farrar (64), Gilbert (56), Pleasantville (36), Winterset (30), Nevada (15) Grinnell (10) and Waukee NW (7) completed the field.
