The difficult thing about doing that is some of the guys do not get enough rest as their turn-around time is not as long, but it good to do as we near the end of the season."


Cristhian Ramirez scored the Wildcats' only goal in the second half. The loss dropped the Wildcats to 7-1 overall, 5-1 in the NCC.

NCC meet set for May 4 at FD

Balanced scoring and overall strength in numbers were the keys for the Humboldt girls' track team in their victory at the Storm Lake Relays on April 27.

The Wildcats won three events and finished with 126 points for the team title. Newell-Fonda was second at 123 in the seven-school field of teams.

"We had another very consistent effort tonight all throughout the lineup. We only won three different events but we had people scoring points for us all over the place," Humboldt head coach Spencer Ross said.

The Wildcats won the 4x800 relay in 11:29.94 and the distance medley relay also claimed first in 4:39.78. The 4x800 includes Sophia Harris, Tori Gargano, Alana Malo and Meg Zweibohmer. The distance medley relay consisted of Tayla Wempen, Kate Sievers, Bella Metli and Brynn Malo

The freshman Malo won the 3,000-meters in 11:51.35. Humboldt was eighter second or third in nine combined events with several fourthplace finishes.

"What really stood out to myself and the other coaches was our sense of team tonight. We did a wonderful job picking each other up and cheering everybody on throughout the night," Ross said.

"You could really see this towards the end of the meet when the team scoring was very tight and it came down to the very last race of the night. We were up by one point heading into the 4x400 and we had to beat Newell-Fonda in that event to capture the team title," Ross said.




