
Class 4A second-ranked Johnston too much for Newton boys soccer

too much fear."




Johnston (10-2) got three goals from Kody Ngo.


"I think the guys saw there's another level of soccer to get to," Jensen said. "They dominated us. But I think we can play with anyone."
