### Hawk trio headlines L-S boys in 1A state qualifier

BROOKLYN — Conner Maston, James Gruver and Corder Noun Harder will represent the Lynnville-Sully boys' track and field team in four events at the state meet this week.

The Hawks clinched four automatic bids at the Class 1A state qualifier hosted by BGM on Thursday and then added a trio of events to their schedule one day later.

"All the work, preparation and competing throughout the year gets you ready for this meet and the opportunity to advance to the state meet or see the season come to a close," L-S head boys track and field coach Darin Arkema said. "We are looking forward to competing at state to try and score a number of team points and bring home a lot of hardware."

Lynnville-Sully's big night led to 116.5 points, which was good enough for second in the district standings. Lisbon won the district title with 174 points and the Hawks edged BCLUW (113.5) by three points on a wet and rainy night.

The rest of the 13-team field featured North Mahaska (63), BGM (56), Moravia (47), Montezuma (46.5), Seymour (33), HLV (31), GMG (23.5), Melcher-Dallas (23), Meskwaki Settlement School (4) and Twin Cedars (2).

to battle, endure the weather elements and make improvements once again in a number of areas," Arkema said.

Maston and Gruver led the way for the Hawks. The senior duo went 1-2 in the 400-meter dash and were separated by just .01 seconds. Gruver also grabbed the automatic bid in the 400 hurdles and the Hawks were either first or second in four relays.

The top finisher in each event at each state qualifier secured an automatic berth into the state meet. The next best 14 performances in each

event earned at-large bids.

Maston won the 400 in 50.61 seconds and Gruver was right there with him at the line in second with a time of

Those times were the fourth- and fifth-best qualifying marks in 1A.

'Conner and James went head-to-head again in the open 400," Arkema said. "However, early in the race, other competitors were pulling ahead or hanging close by until they got onto the homestretch and then both Conner and James found more gears.

"Back and forth all the way to the line where we had a photo finish that determined Conner edged him out by the smallest of margins. But a tremendous race by both guys."

Gruver's winning time of 56.32 seconds in the 400 hurdles was the seventh-best qualifying time. The other wins came in the

sprint medley and 4x400 re-

Bryce Richards, Corder Noun Harder, Gruver and Maston won the sprint medley relay in a season-best 1 minute, 34.14 seconds. That

was the second-best qualify-

The 4x400 relay team featured Caleb Rea, Noun Harder, Gruver and Maston and they won the race in a season-best 3:28.59. That also was the second-best qualify-

The final at-large bids came in the 4x100 and 4x200 relays.

In the 4x100, Kyle Squires, Richards, Rea and Noun Harder finished second at districts with a time of 45.36 seconds, which was the 17th-best qualifying mark.

Richards, Noun Harder, Rea and Maston took second in the 4x200 relay in a season-best 1:32.4 and that time was the sixth-best qualifying mark. The Hawks are the defending state champions in the event, too.

"The Hawks came with great a mindset, focused on the task at hand and seized the opportunity to compete against some great opponents that helped push us to a number of season and personal bests," Arkema said.

L-S finished fifth in both the 4x800 and distance medley relays. In the 4x800, Michael Spooner, Ethan Dunsbergen, Terran Gosselink and Hendrick Lowry finished the race in 9:32.11 and Gentry Walston, Isaac Ver Ploeg, Jack Bowlin and Spooner posted a time of 4:10.18 in the distance medley relay.

# L-S girls punch six state track meet tickets

BROOKLYN — Greenlee Smock and Carsyn McFarland locked up automatic state berths on the track and Abby Squires returns to the state meet in the discus as the Lynnville-Sully girls' track and field team finished second at a Class 1A state qualifier hosted by BGM on Thurs-

The Hawks scored 103 points and edged thirdplace BCLUW by six points. Lisbon won the regional championship with 139 points.

BGM (64.5), North Mahaska (63), Montezuma (62.5), HLV (38.5), Twin Cedars (37), Tri-County (34), GMG (27), Moravia (19.5), Meskwaki Settlement School (17), Seymour (16) and Melcher-Dallas (15) completed the 14team field.

"It was a great night for the Hawks," L-S head girls track and field coach Kevin Johnson said. "The Hawks battled all night long. It was great competition, which is what you want in a district meet. I'm proud of the efforts the girls gave all night long."

McFarland grabbed the automatic berth in the 100-meter dash. She finished the race in 12.99 seconds, which is the fifthbest qualifying time in 1A.

Smock won the 3,000 in 11 minutes, 48.94 seconds. That was the 17th-best qualifying time. Squires' winning throw in the discus was marked at 98 feet, 9 1/2 inches, which was the 23rd-best mark.

The other three state entries were at-large berths.

Tatum Huyser posted a career-best leap of 5-1 in the high jump. She placed third at regionals but has the 11th-best qualifying

The Hawks will compete at state in the 4x100 and

distance medley relays, too. In the 4x100, McFarland, Morgan Hay, Morgan Jones and Huyser placed second in 52.33 seconds, which was the 16th-best qualifying time.

The distance medley relay team included McFarland, Jones, Huyser and Kate Harthoorn and they finished second in a season-best 4:32.18. That was the 23rd-best qualifying
