Four wins highlight Baxter boys' night at state qualifier

MADRID — Three individual wins and a relay victory propelled the Baxter boys' track and field team to a third-place finish at the Class 1A state qualifying meet hosted by Madrid on Thursday.

The wins guaranteed the Bolts went home with four state qualifiers, but Baxter learned the following day that two other entries earned at-large berths.

Carson Scroggins won the 400-meter dash, Logan Rainsbarger claimed a win in the 110 high hurdles and Trice Clapper registered a win in the shot put. The Bolts also won the 4x100 relay and registered eight top-three finishes.

Baxter scored 93 points in third place. Madrid won the district championship with 153 points, while Earlham finished second with 130.

South Hamilton (81) and Collins-Maxwell (69) rounded out the top five and Southeast Warren (53), Colo-NESCO (46), Wayne (34), Ankeny Christian Academy (22), Martensdale-St. Marys (22), Grand View Christian (21), Woodward Academy (6) and Mormon Trail (5) completed the 13-team field.

The winner in each event in each 1A state qualifier secured a state berth and the next best 14 performances in each event also locked down at-large bids.

Scroggins won the 400 in a career-best 52.22 seconds. That was the 21st-best qualifying time.

Rainsbarger completed the 110 high hurdles in 16.31 seconds and that was the 24th-best qualifying time.

Clapper is headed to the state meet after winning the shot put with a toss of 47 feet, 8 inches, which is the 18th-best qualifying mark. Jake Travis finished sixth in the event with a career-best toss of 41-1.

The 4x100 relay team of Cade Robinson, Scroggins, Jake Travis and Cainan Travis won the race with a season-best time of 45.61 seconds. That was the 24th-best qualifying time.

The Bolts secured an at-large state berth in the 4x800 relay. Matt Richardson also clinched his first state berth in the 3,200.

Richardson placed third in the 3,200 with a career-best time of 10 minutes, 11.04 seconds. That's the 15th-best qualifying time.

Perrin Sulzle, Cody Samson,

Logan Jones and Cody Damman ended up second in the 4x800 relay with a season-best time of 8:37.21. They'll go to the blue oval with the 19th-best qualifying time.

Sulzle, Samson and Damman were on the 4x800 relay team that placed 12th at the 1A state meet last spring.

Scroggins, Rainsbarger, Clapper, Robinson, Jones, Jake Travis and Cainan Travis join Richardson as first-time state qualifiers.

The Bolts finished third and fifth in the 100 with Robinson and Treyton Travis, respectively. Robinson posted a career-best time of 12.12 seconds and Treyton Travis hit the finish line in a career-best 12.25.

The 4x400 relay finished fourth. That team featured Cainan Travis, Rainsbarger, Robinson and Scroggins.

The distance medley relay was fifth but nearly clinched an at-large state berth.

The foursome of Rainsbarger, Jake Travis, Cainan Travis and Richardson posted a season-best time of 3:48.91 and the final at-large spot was clocked in 3:48.63.

Treyton Travis finished fifth in the 200 (career-best 24.4) and sixth in the high jump (5-8), Logan Jones (1:03) was sixth in the 400 hurdles and Carter Smith (119-5) ended up sixth in the discus.

The final at-large height in the high jump was 5-10.

Selover, Russell guide

Baxter girls at state qualifier

MADRID — Mande Selover and Camryn Russell saved their best performances for the post-season.

And after a trio of career-best tallies, the Bolts duo will get one more shot to fare even better.

Selover and Russell each punched their tickets to the Class 1A state track and field meet on Thursday during a 1A state qualifier at Madrid High School.

Selover clinched her third state berth and her first in the 400-meter dash after posting a career-best time of 1 minute, 3.55 seconds.

Russell, a freshman, clinched her first state appearance after posting a personal-best time of 16.86 seconds in the 100 hurdles and a career-best leap of 16 feet, 0 3/4 inches in the long jump.

Baxter scored 51 points in eighth place. South Hamilton (97) edged Wayne (93) and Grand View Christian (92) for the re-

gional championship.

Earlham (88), Martensdale-St. Marys (78.5), Madrid (68), Collins-Maxwell (65.5), Baxter (51), Colo-NESCO (33), Southeast Warren (29), Ankeny Christian Academy (27) and Paton-Churdan (12) finalized the 12-team field.

Selover competed in the long jump at the state meet the past few years.

She will be in the 400 on the blue oval for the first time in her career after clinching an at-large spot.

The top finisher in each event at every 1A site gets an automatic berth to state.

There are 14 at-large spots for every event.

Selover's career-best time in the 400 placed her second. She enters the state meet with the 20th-best qualifying time out of 24 competitors.

Camryn Russell earned at-large berths in her two events. She was second in the 100 hurdles and third in the long jump.

The 16.86 in the 100 hurdles gives her the 19th seed at state. Bree Buswell finished fourth in the event and her time of 17.31 seconds was .20 off the final at-large bid.

Camryn Russell and Selover finished second and fifth, respectively, in the long jump.

Russell's career-best mark places her 13th out of 24 for the state meet. Selover's best jump was marked at 15-4 and the final at-large berth was 15-6.

The Bolts set new school records in a pair of relays. But no other events qualified for state.

The shuttle hurdle relay team finished second with a season-best and school-record time of 1:14.13.

That foursome featured Lilyan Headlee, Grace Anderegg, Camryn Russell and Buswell.

Buswell, Camryn Russell, Anderegg and Selover posted a season-best and school-record time of 53.66 seconds in the 4x100 relay. They finished fifth.

The next best individual finish came from Regan Russell. She was sixth in the 800 with a time of 2:44.73.

The 4x800 and distance medley relays placed seventh and the 4x400 relay was eighth.

In the 4x800 relay, Regan Russell, Zoey Gliem, Caydence Sulzle and Morgan Ratliff finished in 11:00.45 and the distance medley relay team of Abby McReynolds, Alyvia Burdess, Sulzle and Ratliff hit the finish line in 5:10.46.

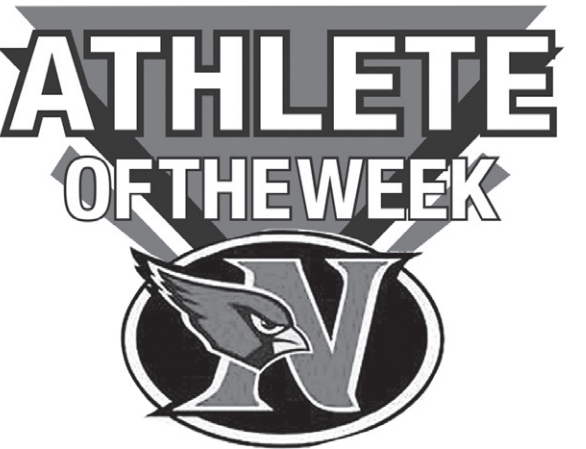
Buswell, Regan Russell, Ratliff and Selover teamed up in the 4x400 and the group placed eighth in 4:51.73.
