#### Girls' wrestling takes off



# Field fundraising went public

The call went out in October to raise funds for the enhancement of new athletic fields adjacent to the MOC-Floyd Valley Elementary School under construction. Original plans for simple baseball, softball and football fields were modified to include a regulation-size track surrounding a turfed football, also incorporating a soccer practice field. The football field will have a bleacher set and press box. The baseball and softball fields will have bleachers, a press box, covered dugouts and batting cages. All three fields will have scoreboards. A storage building, concession stand, and public restrooms are also part of the plan. Also planned is the infrastructure for lights when funds are available. Recreation departments of Orange City and Alton and club-team sports will be able to use the fields, the Pride of the Dutchmen Marching Band, as well as the community at large. Fund-raising goals top out at \$4.8 million. (Illustration submitted)
