In-person absentee voting for the November elections begins Wednesday

In-person absentee voting in the Hamilton County Auditor's Office at the Hamilton County Courthouse, 2300 Superior St., Webster City, begins Wednesday, Oct. 19 during the regular office hours from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.

The last day to cast an absentee ballot at the auditor's office is Monday, Nov. 7, by 4:30 p.m.

The Hamilton County Auditor's Office will be open on Saturday, Nov. 5, from 9 to 5 p.m. for absentee voting.

If you plan to vote absentee by mail, take note: The deadline to request an absentee ballot to be mailed is Monday, Oct. 24, at 5 p.m.

Absentee ballots must be requested in writing. Forms are available at the auditor's office, on the Hamilton County website at www.hamiltoncounty.org, and at the Iowa Secretary of State's website at www.sos.iowa.gov.

Voted ballots returned through the mail must be received in the auditor's office by close of polls on Election Day, Tuesday, Nov. 8 by 8 p.m.
