Four things to know from Monday's Toledo city council meeting

- The Council approved the second payment to D.W. Zinser Company Inc for demolishing the former Iowa Juvenile Home totaling \$123,737.50.
- A public hearing was held for the proposed Fiscal Year 2024 budget, after the hearing, the Council approved the budget certification for the Tama County Auditor.
- The Council approved the purchase of a new street sweeper totaling \$274,973. The new street sweeper will arrive approximately by July 2023.
- The City accepted claims totaling \$167,501.27 from Jan. 10-23.

Four things to know from Monday's Board of Supervisors meeting

- Next week's meeting has been moved from Monday to Tuesday, February 21st at 9:30 am due to President's Day.
- Resolution 02-13-2023A was approved to disburse funds from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) and the Local Assistance and Tribal Consistency Fund (LATC). Tama County was awarded \$3.2 million in ARPA funds and \$100,000 in LATC funds. \$75,000 of LATC funds will be disbursed to the Tama County Sheriff's Department for computer and vehicle equipment. \$100,000 ARPA funds will be disbursed to Tama County Secondary Roads for rock and rock hauling.
- The Veteran Affairs Quarterly Report was approved.
- Claims totaling \$169,397.42 were approved.
