

Iowa Lakes records continued growth for second semester

Measured enrollment growth shows steady movement toward pre-pandemic levels

Iowa Lakes Community College has measured its enrollment growth for the 2022-2023 academic year. The number is moving closer to pre-pandemic figures. "We are very excited about
