He said depending on construction costs, the projects could be done in conjunction and also cost an estimated \$1.2 million,

using farm-to-market dollars.

Andersen said Secondary Roads intends to stick to around \$1 million of road work each year through their five-year plan, although he said it can vary each year depending on construction costs.
