DES MOINES, ORANGE CITY – The MOC-Floyd Valley Dutch baseball team ended its marathon week with two wins on Saturday, June 24 against Solon and Waverly-Shell Rock at the Prange Classic in Des Moines. The Dutch then knocked off Sheldon on Monday, June 26 at home.

"The Prange Classic is one of the best tournaments in Iowa and it was fun to see some other teams from the East side of the state," said MOC-Floyd Valley coach Brian Wede.

In the first game against the Solon Spartans, the Dutch gave up a run in the first and both teams had a run each in the fourth. MOC-Floyd Valley got a run in the fifth inning to tie it and MOC-Floyd Valley had four runs in the top of the seventh to win it.

"Solon has three of the best players in Iowa and it was a good win for us," said Wede.

Blake Aalbers, Kael Arends and Brooks McCarty all had two hits with Arends getting two runs batted in with a single and a double. McCarty allowed two hits with three walks and five strikeouts to earn the win with two runs given up. Thomas Vandermyde went an inning and struck out one and didn't allow a hit in the final inning

"Brooks McCarty did a great job on the mound and Thomas Vandermyde finished the deal after we scored four in the seventh. The bottom of our order did a really good job and got on base a lot," said Wede.

The Dutch then faced the Waverly Shell-Rock Go-Hawks and scored five in the second and one in the third for a 6-0 lead. MOC-Floyd Valley did give up two in the fifth but answered with three and held on to win 9-5. Arends and Nikolai Wede each had two hits and Wede had two runs batted in. Carson Jager had a triple and knocked in two runs and scored two.

"We were able to put some pressure on them early with bunts and steals that helped to lead to five runs in the second," said

Kooper Huss pitched four and two-third innings with four hits, two runs allowed and three walks and had five strikeouts. Blake Aalbers pitched an inning and two-thirds and struck out three with no hits allowed.

Wede went four and two-third innings and struck out six with a run allowed and one hit given up. Kaleb Koerselman and Braden Konz went an inning and a third and an inning respectively with Koerselman allowed a hit and Konz didn't give up a hit.

The Dutch are 22-7 this season and will face Boyden-Hull/Rock Valley on Wednesday night, Sergeant Bluff Luton on Friday and Sioux Center on Monday, July 3.

Award celebrates years of coaching girls' golf

ORANGE CITY — Monte Tilgner was inducted into the Iowa High School Golf Coaches Hall of Fame at a luncheon ceremony at Veenker Memorial Golf Course in Ames on Monday, June 19.

The award follows 26 years of coaching girls golf at MOC-Floyd Valley Community School District. Tilgner coached the team from 1994 through 2019.

The Dutch made 14 state appearances as a team in those years, placing as runner-up four times, twice placing third. Individuals qualified for state play four times when the team did not qualify.

Other team landmarks Tilgner noted included 20 Siouxland Conference championships, including 17 straight conference championships from 2000 through 2017, 31 consecutive conference wins from 2007 through 2011 and 27 straight conference wins from 2014 through 2017.

Tilgner notched a career record at MOC-Floyd Valley of 1,965 wins and 182 losses.

Tilgner noted two students who went on to notice in the sport. Mikkell (Korver) Baker was individual state champion in 2000 and 2001 and was elected to the lowa Golf Coaches Association Players Hall of Fame in 2013. Mallory Simmelink is now a PGA professional and club pro at Landsmeeer Golf Course in Orange City. "I had a long career and had many very good players who were willing to listen and put in a great amount of time and effort," Tilgner said, "leading to a very successful program."

Tilgner was inducted with fellow coaches Toni Dickey of Ankeny, Bill Alexander of Okoboji, Tracy Johnson of Valley, Tim O'Brien of Cedar Rapids Xavier and Teri Taylor of Maquoketa.
