day would bring healing, despite all that had happened, the community would make it.

In a gesture of faith, Pastor Hornback shared this prayer as the audience bowed their heads in silence.

"Dear heavenly Father, we thank you for your presence in our lives. Your presence is always with us but especially at difficult times. Thank you for this community that's come together and all of those who have helped us through the hard times in the last year. And today I pray for a time of healing for the broken hearted and may this service bring continued healing to each one of us. And I pray that this time will also remind us as we continue to move forward day by day that our hope is in you."

Music then filled the air as the congregation sang the hymn "It Is Well With My Soul", sharing the message that although life can be unpredictable and challenging, faith can help overcome it.

"Yet even in the midst of destruction and heartache, we witnessed the courage and the strength and heartache of our Emergency Management Director, Dio, our firemen, our police officers, our sheriff's department, our hospital employees, our ambulance crews, Eldon and Velva Cole as they directed feeding and sheltering for volunteers here at New Bridge Church. Other community pastors from Winterset and Madison County Churches and hundreds of volunteers who came to Madison County to share their love, their hope and their work and to work alongside us. They stood with us shoulder to shoulder in order to help put the pieces back together," said New Bridge Pastor John Schaull as he addressed the audience.

At approximately 4:35 p.m. Emergency Management Director Dio Ayala walked to the podium and read the names of victims who perished as a result of the weather event. The time of day was significant as it

was meant to match the hour and minutes when the tornado touched down in 2022.



ny came to a close with the hymn "Amazing Grace" followed by a prayer from Pastor Mark Morehouse of the Winterset First United Methodist Church, wherein the words, "Lord God, in the days, and weeks, and months and years ahead watch over us, heal us, bind up our broken hearts" resonated with the crowd.
