# **Seven bids locked in**

## Several on bubble for at-large berths

he Iowa Falls-Alden boys track team departed Dike with seven automatic bids to the State Track and Field Championships, but there is a strong possibility that by the end of the day on Friday, that number may increase.

Competing at Thursday's State Qualifier, the Cadets powered to a second-place finish in the team standings, tallying 113 points to finish in the runner-up spot to Grundy Center (129).

Junior Jaden Damiano has put himself in position to repeat history, as he won both the 110 and 400 hurdle events. Last spring, Damiano won state titles in both of those races and has another chance to achieve the feat next week in Des Moines. He added a 100 meter title (14.43) as well.

At the start of the meet, IF-A scored its first automatic berth, when Kacen Boyer conquered the long jump field with a best measurement of 21'4.50".

Andrew Bicknese secured a 200 meter race ticket to the blue oval with a firstplace effort time of 22.85.

The Cadets have two automatic bids in the relays, as the 4x200 and sprint medley finished first and second respectively. The 4x200 group of Boyer, Aidan Richards, Quinton Jaeger and Bicknese clocked a 1:32.72, while the sprint med (Richards, Andon Barrick, Bicknese and Nathan Schmitz) took silver in 1:36.04.

IF-A has several events on the bubble to receive at-large bids. Schmitz was third in the 400 meters (51.93), while the 4x100 (Boyer, Richards, Schmitz, Jaeger) and 4x400 (Damiano, Boyer, Schmitz, Bicknese) also earned bronze finishes. Those two relays clocked times of 44.82 and 3:28.86 respectively.

Kaden Steffen broke a school record with a 49'3" toss in the shot put. That put him fifth in the field on Thursday, but on the bubble for an at-large bid.

he familiar names that have helped carry the points load for the Iowa Falls-Alden girls track program during the past 3-4 years answered the bell again at Thursday's Class 2A State Qualifier Meet in Dike.

Sprinter Jazz Dagel and distance runner Teah Miller delivered in multiple events, as the duo combined for four automatic berths into next week's State Track and Field Championships.

Dagel will return to Des Moines in both the 100 and 200 meters, as she won both events. The Cadet senior crossed the finish line in 12.74 to win the 100, and followed that with a 26.59 time to take the tape in the 200.

Miller did not win any golds, but grabbed the second automatic qualifier spot in both the 3000 and 800 meter events. She finished the 3000 in 10:50.41 to finish behind Manson Northwest-Webster's Alyssa Richman (10:41.64).

Later in the meet, Miller clocked a 2:24.47 and narrow-

The Cadets added a third-place effort in the sprint medley, where the foursome of Dagel, Kenley Chaplin, Angel Sharar and Abby Harding combined for a 1:55.34 finish. The relay was more than two seconds

Then it is all said and done, there weren't many surprises from the Class 2A State Qualifier in Dike.

The South Hardin events that were supposed to make it did and others that were on the bubble were still waiting for at large bids. Between the Tiger boys and girls, there were four automatic qualifiers and five that were waiting to hear.

SH opened with a win in the high jump. Sophomore Traven Wheeler broke a school record and made his Des Moines debut earlier this spring at the Drake Relays. He won the high jump as the only athlete to clear 6'2" and became the first automatic qualifier of the night.

He will be joined by teammate Chizzy Richmond. Richmond is also not making his Drake Stadium debut. He was one fourth of the 4x200 that made it last spring. This time, he is running in multiple opens.
