The Main Duties of Veterans Affairs Office

The main duties of the Veterans Affairs Office are to help veterans become aware of what benefits they may be entitled to and to assist them as they navigate the processes of obtaining these benefits.

This ranges from VA home loans to educational benefits to disability benefits, to nursing home benefits, burial benefits, to retirement pensions and much more.

Don Thompson, Veterans Affairs Director, said the main duty of his office is to be an advocate for veterans and their families.

"I do medical research, civilian legal and veteran law research, and much more,"he said. "Some veterans claims take as little as 1/2 hour to complete the paperwork on, other claims I have up to 20 or 30 hours into."

Services Vetearns Affairs Office:

Thompson deals predominantly with veterans, so 99% of what he does is geared directly to the veteran community.

He tries to reach the general public through stories in the Veterans Corner articles. Some of the articles are geared specifically for veterans, but not all of them.

In May 2023, Thompson will hit the three year mark

as the veteran service officer.

"What I like the most about my job is being able to make a difference in the life of my veterans and their families," he said."A lot of what I do leads to positive changes for them that will last the rest of their lives. It may be in the form of a pension or monthly check for disability compensation, or helping them gain access to VA health care. It might be something as simple as helping with groceries or utilities, or any combination of all items previously mentioned."

When a veteran opens up to Thompson and start really talking to him,

sharing their stories, hopes, fears, anger or more, this humbles him and he feels honored that they trust him enough to do that.

"I've had grown men sitting in my office in tears while sharing their story and I've had a few women walk in and say "I am about to become a widow and I'm scared to death' or "I have just become a widow and I don't know what to do."Those are hard conversations to have, very painful conversations, even for me!"Thompson said.

He said he thinks people know that when they come into his office that they are in a safe place and that he will not abandon them.

"I will do everything I can for them," Thompson said."This trust they put in me is sacred, and it is the interactions with the people that come to see me, the work we do together, and the results they eventually get. That, is my favorite thing about this job."




